Photo Challenge for Easter:

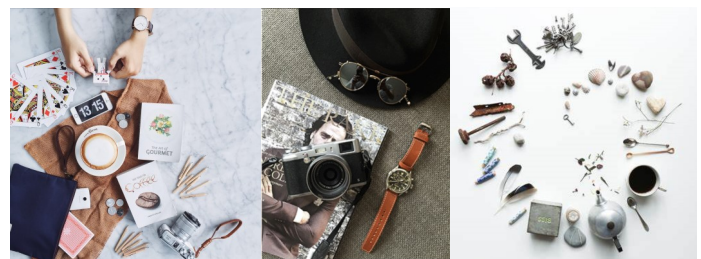

What's a Flat Lay photograph? It is taken directly from above, like a bird's eye view. Think about:

- What will your background (bottom layer) be—plate? Piece of wood? Table top? Piece of fabric? Paper?
- Making sure you are directly over the top with your camera and then crop it to make it tidy
- Give it a title
